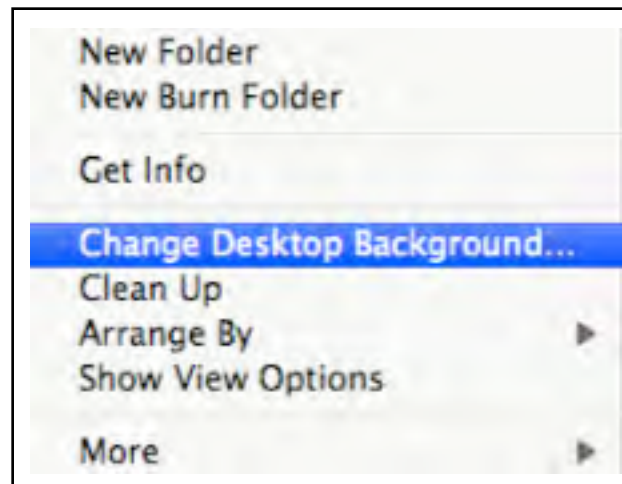


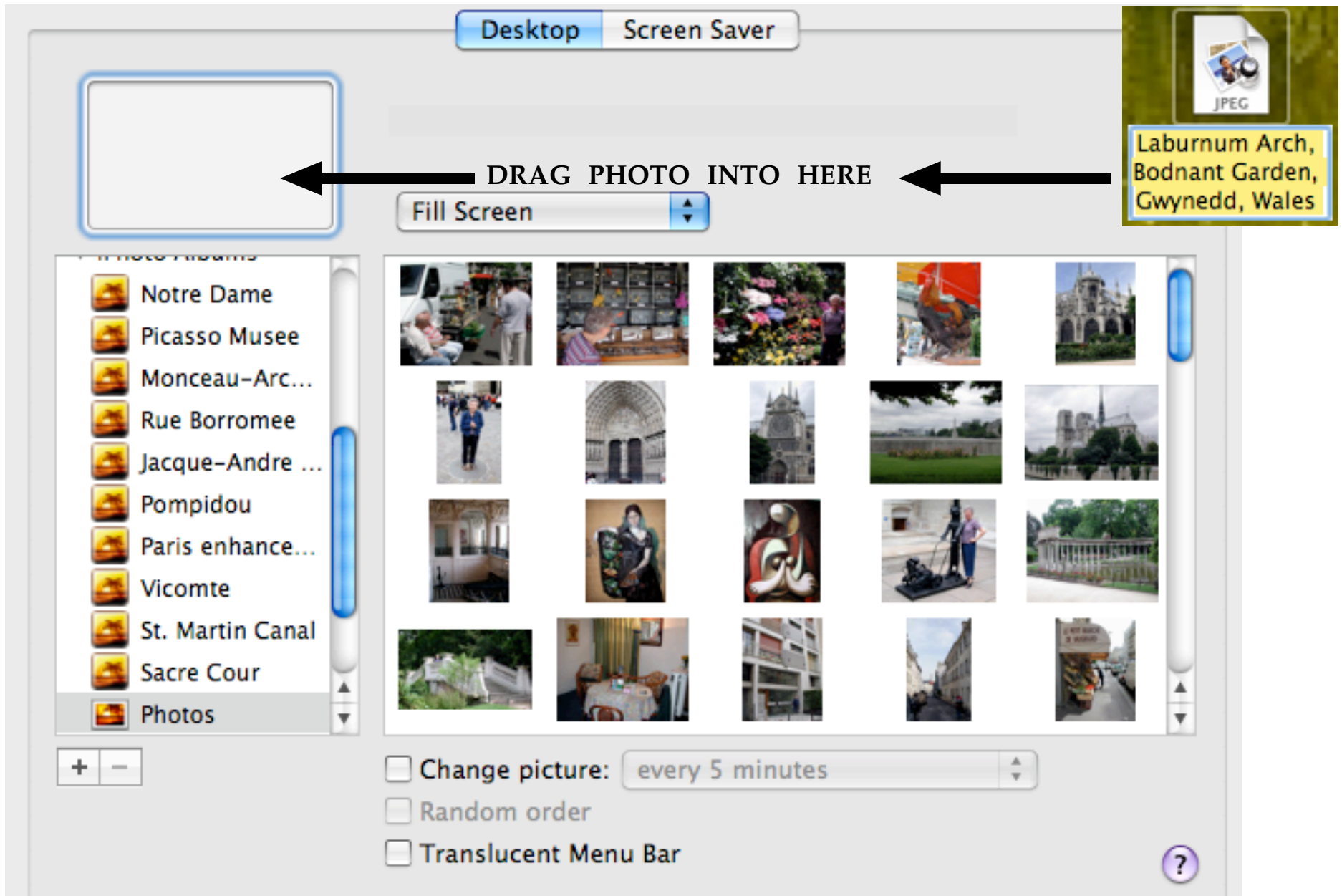
# USING A DESKTOP PHOTO FOR SCREENSAVER

1. Occasionally I'll see a new photo on the internet of some place we've visited on our travels and would like to use as a screensaver (*Make sure it isn't a copyrighted pic. Best sources: Wikipedia or Wiki Travels*). I download it to my desktop and go on to Step 2.
2. I *Control-click* on the *Finder* window where a different photo is currently my screensaver.
3. In the Finder window a box appears; I then select *Change Desktop Background*



4. The following window will appear next on your desktop. Of course you can select any of the photos from the folder showing. In this example, however, I drag the photo on my desktop into the blank rectangle in the upper left hand corner of the window. (If another photo is in that box, dragging a new one over it will replace it.)



5. The photo you dragged into the blank rectangle will automatically become your desktop “screensaver” and will remain as such until you change it.

Here's what your desktop will look like with the new photo.
